The teachers and coordinators at the heart of the MusicLink Foundation pride themselves on reaching goals



through their dedication to helping promising students in need. A quick glance at the graph below shows that in the coming year we can easily reach 6,000 students, and 400,000 hours of instruction, equivalent to \$10 million of in-kind scholarship donation. However, this continual growth relies on solid financial footing to secure ongoing operational costs as well as expand our scholarship and grant programs to students and teachers. We rely solely on the ongoing support of our many donors.

The MusicLink Foundation is in an enviable position of being able to sustain the costs of the program with a remarkably small budget. Our teachers donate in-kind instruction equivalent to \$700,000 annually. We are seeking to sustain our basic ongoing annual operational costs of \$70,000–\$100,000. This equates to leverage of 10% operational costs to services provided to students and teachers.

To achieve this goal, we are establishing MusicLink Legacy Partners—a group of prominent

donors who share our mission and will pledge to support the foundation with an annual donation of from \$5,000 to \$10,000 or more for the next three years to secure a financial base for the organization. As the program grows over the next three years, we will renew these pledges from our *MusicLink Legacy Partners*. In return, these partners will be recognized with logos and signage at MusicLink events and be featured in our publicity and communications.

## Meet Our First MusicLink Legacy Partners Bill and Brigid Brakefield, our first










Jessica Bremseth, a student of Kathleen Van Doeren, received the Ruth Stenson MusicLink Award for 2013. This \$1000 award recognizes a graduating high school senior from Minnesota who has shown outstanding achievement in musical training through MusicLink. Jessica has continually achieved

superior plus ratings in the National Guild Auditions and passed the MMTA theory examinations with distinction. This year she was a winner in the MMTA SRA contest, performing in their honor recital. Jessica will be attending the University of St. Thomas in Minnesota.

MUSICLINK RESEARCH: Dr. Joanne Haroutounian. Executive Director of the MusicLink Foundation, presented a session reporting research findings entitled "What Music Means to Me: A Study of Promising Students in Need" at the MTNA Convention in Anaheim CA in March, 2013. The research showed that our nomination form had high reliability (0.86-0.91) and students overall showed a high level of potential talent rated by school teachers, independent teachers and parents (3.19-3.28 out of 4). Analysis of 3,000 student evaluation forms show an overall high level of achievement (3.15-3.37 out of 4) with highest ratings in the area of repertoire progress.

Interview studies and surveys of students who are now over 18 years old and took lessons through MusicLink for 5 years or more paint a portrait of successful young adults in a variety of career choices. All showed exceptionally high levels of musical achievement.

- 99% attended college (including Juilliard, MIT, Stanford, Yale, Berklee School of Music)
- 39% received partial to full scholarships for college.

#### PLAYATHONS & MORE RAISE OVER \$24,900 FOR OUR KIDS

MusicLink Playathons continue to spread across the country, with a grand total of \$22,754 contributed through these events to help bring music lessons to promising students in need. Judy

Vanesse, MusicLink NE Coordinator, organized several playathons combining Vermont and New Hampshire students, raising a total of \$1,473. Minnesota carried on its Singers in MN



tradition of the most students and the most money raised in its playathon at the Mall of America. Despite a February snowstorm, 221 students performed on piano, violin, flute, oboe, bassoon, guitar and voice, raising \$10,700 for MusicLink kids.

Virginia MusicLink had several playathons. Fairfax-Loudoun Music Fellowship raised \$2000, with 170 students performing in December, organized by Sandy Baker. Northern Virginia teachers and students held a playathon at Tysons Corner raising \$2,186. The year ended with an in-home playathon by Bill Brakefield that raised \$5,795 for MusicLink.

Promise to Practice events continue, with college students in practice rooms at Western Illinois University contributing \$656 for a week of solid practice! Teachers bring this rewarding event to their studios with Mary Ranke Tamplin (MD) raising \$455 and a solid semester of student practice. Sally Sumner (CA) chose to sponsor a benefit recital for MusicLink, raising \$1,022 to benefit MusicLink students. Students even wrapped presents at Barnes and Noble in VA, raising \$100 for MusicLink. These totals add \$2,233 in MusicLink donations, each reflecting a unique fund-raising event.

#### MUSICLINK DONATES TO SANDY HURRICANE

RELIEF: The MusicLink Foundation donated \$2,200 to help the many homeless families in the Long Island area devastated by hurricane Sandy, thanks to the wonderful performances of over 60 Long Island students representing the studios of 6 teachers. #### CAMP SCHOLARSHIPS

The MusicLink Foundation provides the opportunity for students to attend the music camp of their choice. This year we sent 25 students to camps The Witherspoon children



across the country with scholarships totaling \$5,223.76. Students attended local summer programs in WI, WA, LA, TX, NH, VT, OR, and CO as well as the Un. of MN Bravo String and Keyboard Institute; CT Valley Harp Intensive; Oregon Suzuki Institute; SMF International Music Festival in Utah.

#### TEACHER REIMBURSEMENT & GRASS ROOTS

GRANTS: The MusicLink Foundation provides reimbursement to teachers for student music and event fees. This year, 32 teachers from 14 different states asked for reimbursement, totaling \$2,330 in reimbursement grants.

Our Grass Roots Grant programs assist new MusicLink programs or projects. This year the foundation provided \$1,550 to the following organizations to promote state and local programs: MN: Minnesota Music Teachers Association—MusicLink Program; VT: Judy Vanesse Studio; CO: Tickled Ivories program; WA: Sweet Potato Music.

BUSINESS PARTNERS: MusicLink relies heavily on business support at the community level. INSTRUMENTS/IN KIND DONATIONS: The MusicLink Foundation received \$12,157 of in-kind donations of instruments and music this year, not including over \$25,000 in discounted and free music distributed directly to MusicLink teachers through our Business Partner discount program. In-kind donors are italicized in our donor list in the Annual report.

GRANT SUPPORT: The Louise P. Zanar Fund of the Community Foundation for the National Capital Region provided \$5000 in funding for our DC "Shining Stars" program, providing private lessons to underprivileged students. The City of Fairfax Commission in the Arts continued their support with \$1000 for our northern Virginia program. We also received \$1000 from the Buckley Charity Fund of the Fed. Lodge No. 1, FAAM.
