MusicLink Celebrates its 25th Anniversary!

It is hard to believe that MusicLink's simple idea of linking an eager, deserving student with a caring professional teacher will reach a landmark goal of 25 years in 2017! The simple program began in Virginia in 1992, expanding into the MusicLink Foundation, a 501(C)(3) organization, in 2001. MusicLink has reached over 6,500 students nationwide and extended into 5 Canadian provinces, with our dedicated teachers contributing over 450,000 hours of instruction to the program, equivalent to over \$11.5 million of in-kind donations.

We are pleased to share the accomplishments MusicLink has made dur-

ing the past 2015–2016 year in this Annual Report as well as asking you to celebrate with us by supporting our students and teachers with a donation through mail or through the website. We have set a "double goal" of reaching \$50,000 by the end of January 2017 thanks to several major donors who have provided matching grants to encourage donor participation in this celebratory year.

The MusicLink Foundation is proud of the grass-roots quality of the organization. We essentially use home-based offices for the staff and coordinators that network to seek out students and link them to teachers. MusicLink teachers agree to take on students for as long as they wish to learn, donating in-kind instruction equivalent to \$700,000 annually. Business partners are generous with materials, books, and internet opportunities to thank these teachers for their dedication to the program. Local music dealers offer discounts

on music, instruments, and materials to MusicLink teachers and students in their communities.

We thank all of our donors for continually supporting us through annual contributions, music camp sponsorship of individual students, and the generous support from our MusicLink Legacy Partners at the Bravo (\$5K) and Encore (\$10K) levels. 


The MusicLink Foundation has set goals and new projects in 2017 to celebrate our 25th Anniversary year. Details include:


MUSICLINK FOUNDATION STATUS REPORT

MusicLink Accomplishments 2015–2016

MUSICLINK FOUNDATION TO RECEIVE THE MTNA 2017 ACHIEVEMENT AWARD



The Music Teachers National Association Board of Directors will recognize the MusicLink Foundation with the 2017 MTNA Achievement Award at its March national conference. The award recognizes individuals or organizations that have made significant and lasting contributions to music and music teaching. The MusicLink Foundation is only the second organization to receive this award in its 27-year history.

In a letter from Executive Director, Gary L. Ingle, he notes that "it was obvious to me that MusicLink was one of the most important programs in music teaching. The partnership we forged between MTNA and MusicLink to expand its influence nationally was exactly right at the time. It has been such a pleasure to watch the program grow under your vision and leadership and to see it benefit thousands of at-risk and needy children across the country."

SENIOR AWARD WINNERS

The MusicLink Foundation was pleased and proud to have a total of 16 students graduating high school in 2016. These outstanding students were featured in our July 2016 eLINK, available through the newsletter archives on the News page on our website. We encourage you to read their impressive stories.

SENIOR AWARD WINNER: Mariana Pye of Abilene TX was awarded the MusicLink Senior Award of Excellence, which recognizes a graduating senior who has shown outstanding musical progress and commitment through years of MusicLink lessons. The \$1000 award is provided by the Arline and Russell Bridge Endowment Fund.

Mariana as having "a rare gift for music, excelling to superior levels in all that she does. She has overcome obstacles of being two years younger than her classmates, race, and her father's heart issues with grace, dignity, faith and a quiet determination beyond her years."

Mariana carries an academic average near 100 and is a UIL math competitor. In music, she was a finalist in the Abilene Philharmonic Nelda Hodges Young Artist Competition in 2014 and won third place in 2016. She has received Superior Plus ratings in Piano Guild Auditions and NFMC Festivals for multiple years, and a gold medal in TMTA theory tests with a perfect score of 101 for six consecutive years. Mariana was awarded the Texas MTA Glenda Lanier Theory Award, the TMTA Studio Affiliate Participation honorable mention and won first place in the TMTA Whitlock Memorial Award, the highest honor bestowed to a senior by TMTA.

Mariana enjoys performing in community Artwalks at the Grace Museum and Center for Contemporary Art and other local venues. She received MusicLink camp scholarships for several years, attending the Abilene Summer Piano Camp. Mariana is attending Texas Tech University, majoring in engineering, while continuing her musical studies in performance and composition.

MusicLink Achievement Honors: Several MusicLink seniors received MusicLink Achievement Honor Awards of \$500, recognizing high school seniors who show exceptional progress in lessons.

"I hope to perform and write as much music as I can, with plans to study performance in the near future. I hope to travel all over the world and share musical knowledge with others. Timothy is the 2016 recipient of the Ruth Stenson MusicLink Award of \$1,000, established in memory of a MusicLink teacher to a graduating senior in Minnesota who has shown outstanding achievement through the MusicLink program.

FUND RAISING EVENTS ACROSS THE COUNTRY

We are so pleased to see the idea of "kids helping kids" through musical events taking hold in different parts of the county. These events not only help bring needed funds to MusicLink, but provide a way for students to perform for others in their communities. The MusicLink Foundation received a total of \$15,320 from all of these wonderful events in 2015–16.

VA BENEFIT RECITAL: Helena Goldberg initiated a benefit recital at Melodee Music in Sterling, VA, that featured adult performers—Tim Otis, Helena Goldberg and Robbie Taylor as well as six student performers. The recital raised \$235 for MusicLink, showing how a single teacher, with a few colleagues, can show how "kids can help kids" through music.

IL CLAVINOVA FESTIVAL: A Clavinova festival was held in conjunction with the Second Annual Christmas Tree Walk on Dec. 12, 2015, at The Beacon in Waterloo, IL. It featured performances by 26 students from the studios of LeAnn Halvorson and Deborah Meier, our MusicLink IL coordinator. A total of \$900 was collected through student pledges for the MusicLink Foundation to help pay for practice instruments, music, piano moving and tunings, instrument repairs, and summer music camp scholarships.

VA HOLIDAY RECITALS: Each year the Fairfax-Loudoun Music Fellowship hosts a holiday fundraising event for MusicLink. Last December the event was beautifully organized by Amy Work and included student performances throughout the month of December. A total of 14 teachers participated with 184 students performing at the beautiful Lansdowne Resort. The event raised close to \$3,000 for the MusicLink Foundation.


MN PLAYATHON: The eighth annual Minnesota MusicLink Playathon took place at the Mall of America in February, 2016, raising over \$9,000 for the MusicLink Foundation. Sue Wege, the MusicLink Director of Coordinators organized the successful weekend event, working with MMTA teacher volunteers. The amazing event featured 247 student performers from the studios of 48 teachers. The playathon included a Popular Styles Hour with a live band and some visiting royalty—Miss Minnesota Outstanding Teen, Rachel Weyandt and the NAM Miss Minnesota Jr. Teen, Michelle Bergh serving as emcees for the event. Schmitt Music provided a Boston grand piano and Roland keyboard for student performances.

NY: Patricia Cestaro, Northport NY's MusicLink Coordinator organized a MusicLink benefit fundraiser, working with Tami Levy, Olivia Godlib and Sam Varon of the Faust Harrison Piano Store, which provided a 7-foot grand piano and Clavinova for the event. The event was held in April 2016 at the Walt Whitman Shops in Melville NY. The all-day event featured 45 musicians representing students, teachers, amateur and professional musicians and raised \$1,700 for the MusicLink Foundation.

MN PEDALING FOR PIANOS: The annual Pedaling for Pianos event took place in St. Paul MN in August, 2016, with 20 bikers enjoying a beautiful bike ride, with a mini-recital by six students on one of the painted pianos at the Keys 4/4 Kids store. Keys 4/4 Kids places pianos around the city for performance opportunities. The event, organized by Eric Bell and Sue Wege, MusicLink's National Director of Coordinators, raised \$485 for the MusicLink Foundation.

CAMP SCHOLARSHIPS & CAMP SPONSOR PROGRAM

The MusicLink Foundation provides the opportunity for students to attend the music camp of their choice. During the summer of 2016, the foundation provided scholarships totaling \$3,725. Students enjoyed summer programs that included the Piano Institute at Ithaca College, Interlochen Arts Camp, Baylor University Summer Organ Institute, Abilene Summer Piano Camp, Kansas City Strings Music Camp, DCC Performing Arts Institute in NY, and WSU Summer Keyboard camp.



The MusicLink Camp Sponsor Program is a wonderful way for donors to personalize their contributions of \$250 or more for a specific MusicLink student seeking a music camp experience. TEACHER REIMBURSEMENT & GRASS ROOTS GRANTS

Our Grass Roots Grant program assists new MusicLink programs or projects. This year the foundation awarded grants totaling \$500 to the Minnesota Music Teachers Association to assist with their MusicLink programs.
