


The MusicLink Foundation set goals and new projects in 2017 to celebrate our 25th Anniversary year. We are making great progress as we head into December.

- Creation of a new fund-raising website—www.fundmusiclink.com
- 25 five-star reviews on www.greatnonprofits.org. We earned the 2017 top-rated non-profit organization badge on our website.
- 25th new student for 2017 is Rose Ake Modesto who received a \$50 gift certificate and a MusicLink tote bag.

- 25th new teacher for 2017 is Sheila Dacus who received a group of pedagogy books by our Executive Director, Joanne Haroutounian.
- Minnesota is the state that has added the largest number of MusicLink students (29) in 2017. We will be featuring this vibrant program in an upcoming eLINK. Other states that were “runners up” were Oregon (16), Virginia (15), and North Carolina (14).

- 25 new business partners and local music/piano dealers added to our roster. We are getting close to our goal with 15 new partners.


MUSICLINK FOUNDATION STATUS REPORT

MusicLink Accomplishments 2016–2017

MTNA Convention—Achievement Award and Booth Activity

The Music Teachers National Association Board of Directors awarded the MusicLink Foundation with the 2017 MTNA Achievement Award at its March national conference in Baltimore, MD. This is the highest award given by MTNA and recognizes individuals or organizations that have made significant

SENIOR AWARD WINNER: Emily Fillmore (IA) received the 2017 MusicLink Senior Achievement Award of \$1000 provided by the Arline and Russell Bridge Endowment Fund. The award recognizes a graduating senior who has shown outstanding musical progress and commitment through years of MusicLink lessons.

Emily has been a violin student of Linda Judiesch since the age of five at the Preucil School of Music in Iowa City. Emily has been in the Iowa All-State Orchestra for the past four years and received the National School Orchestra Award from Muscatine High School. Emily has taught a few students, explaining “in my future I hope to teach children to love music from an early age. Eventually I would like to have my own violin studio.” Emily plans to continue her performance studies at Brigham Young University in Idaho.

RUTH STENSON MUSICLINK AWARD: Jotham Bremseth (MN) was awarded the 2017 Ruth Stenson Memorial MusicLink Award. The award of \$1000 recognizes the outstanding achievement of a graduating senior from the state of Minnesota. The award is

dedicated to Ruth Stenson, a MusicLink teacher who spent many years teaching students through the program.

MusicLink Fundraising Events Bring Music to the Community

IL CLAVINOVA FESTIVAL: This year’s Clavinova festival was held in conjunction with the Second Annual Christmas Tree Walk on Dec. 10, 2016 at The Beacon in Waterloo, IL. The event featured performances by 34 students from the studios of Grace Reuter, LeAnn Halvorson, Sherri Jones, Gillian Cerbin, and MusicLink Illinois Coordinator, Deb Meier. A total of \$965 was collected through student pledges for the MusicLink Foundation to help pay for practice instruments, music, piano moving and tunings, instrument repairs, and summer music camp scholarships. Our thanks to Steve Trawford for continuing to provide space and support for this annual event and to Yamaha for providing a digital piano as a grand prize for a drawing at the event.

VA HOLIDAY RECITALS: Each year the Fairfax-Loudoun Music Fellowship hosts a holiday fundraising event for the MusicLink Foundation at the beautiful Lansdowne Resort. This year there were a total of 165 students from the studios of 14 teachers, with student performances throughout the month of December. The event raised close to \$2,475 for the MusicLink Foundation. The event included a coffee shop talent show organized by Christina Roukis with members of the Freedom High School band, which raised \$320 for MusicLink. The fellowship looks forward to hosting future events realizing it is “a wonderful way of reaching the community and giving back to those in need who deserve to have the gift of music in their lives.”



OK: A new organization to MusicLink fundraising, the SAI Oklahoma City chapter (Alpha Zeta Chapter) held “Province Day” where members come together and “celebrate sisterhood and the presence of women in music.” This year, the organization chose the MusicLink Foundation as the recipient of their fundraising efforts, which raised \$166 for the MusicLink Foundation.



MN: To celebrate MusicLink Foundation’s 25th anniversary of bringing musical instruction to low income children, Minnesota set a goal to make this year’s playathon on February 11–12 at the Mall of America the biggest and best ever! MMTA teachers responded with a record 53 teachers sending over 260 students to perform, raising \$12,000 for the MusicLink Foundation. Sue Wege, the MusicLink

Director of Coordinators, organized the successful weekend event, working with many MMTA teacher volunteers. The event featured the “royalty” of Madeline Van Ert, the reigning Miss Minnesota, Rachel Weyandt, 2015 Miss Minnesota Outstanding Teen and Michelle Bergh, International Miss Midwest Teen 2016.

Students especially enjoyed the Popular Styles Hour with students either performing piano solos or jamming with “The Katzen Jammers” led by Doug Rohde who also emceed this special hour. Schmitt Music provided a Boston grand piano for student performances.



NY: The annual New York MusicLink play-athon was held in April 2017 at the Walt Whitman Shops in Hunting Station, NY.

The event, organized by MusicLink coordinator Patrica Cestaro, raised \$4,360 for the MusicLink Foundation. Students and teachers performed in the rotunda of the mall on a Yamaha grand piano. The piano, Clavinova and sound system were provided by the Faust Harrison Piano Store. Munro Music donated four \$50.00 gift certificates that were awarded to the top fundraisers. Student leaders were Olivia Gotlib and Gabby Bica, with Areille Harvey serving as student photographer.

MO: Helen Haynes of the Jefferson City Music Academy joined fundraising efforts for MusicLink raising \$325 through a Promise to Practice event prior to her studio’s spring recital. “It gave my students that extra push to really shine in the recital and we will be doing this again, extending to our whole studio.”


