He has composed for choir, baritone solo and piano including orchestral arrangements for the Metropolitan Youth Symphony Orchestra.

His teacher describes Adrian as "a musician through and through. He lives and breathes music. He applies himself diligently and takes on challenging piano repertoire."

Adrian explains that "music has the power to create a meaningful impact on those around you." He was inspired to seek out opportunities after the pandemic through the Piano Santa Foundation that provided him with a piano and the MusicLink Foundation that provided reduced fee lessons, helping him to continue his piano lessons without worrying about finances. In his words, "music has been and will be a part of my everyday life. Music has become part of my identity. It also helps my growth as a person, as it has taught me valuable skills such as memory, practice and repetition. I have made it my goal to whatever college I attend to minor in music and participate in the choir, I also hope I find time to compose and make more music as it helps my creativity flourish." Adrian plans to attend Gonzaga University, minoring in music.

Elizabeth performed with the Edmonds-Woodway Philharmonic Orchestra, the Seattle Collaborative Orchestra and performed the Haydn Violin Concerto in G Major with the EWHS Philharmonic Orchestra in April.

From Elizabeth's essay: "Musical study is a flexible and creative endeavor, a personal journey in perseverance and collaboration, and a powerful tool for self-expression. I feel that my life has been personally enriched through music. When I am able to perform and share the music that I have been working on with others, when I hear the different parts of the orchestra coming together to create a beautiful sound during a concert; when I perform in chamber groups with my friends; these moments motivate me to continue studying music."

Elizabeth plans to attend Brandeis University, and was the recipient of the prestigious Leonard Bernstein Fellowship, a special scholarship that Brandeis University awards to one violin student each year. The Fellowship will allow her to continue involvement in music through participation in the Brandeis-Wellesley Orchestra, private lessons, professional chamber coaching and a range of unique performance experiences. Elizabeth hopes to major in neuroscience with a minor in music.

Gerald Christoff MusicLink Award Established Anmy Paulino Collado 2024 Winner



Anmy Paulino Collado received the Gerald Christoff MusicLink Award of \$1,000. This newly established award stems from funding provided to the foundation after the death of Rosemary Christoff, who initially established the Gerald Christoff Endowment Fund. The award is given to a student who shows outstanding achievement in MusicLink lessons and resides in New York state or takes lessons from a teacher living in New York state.

Anmy showed determination from the start, personally reaching out to the MusicLink Foundation to request piano lessons with a teacher who could speak Spanish to they could communicate with her mother to make arrangements. Julie Wegener, the MusicLink NYC coordinator was so touched by this letter from an eight year -old that she instantly accepted Anmy as a student, and continued to teach her for the past 9 years. Anmy attended the prestigious Horace Mann High School on full scholarship which provided overseas opportunities for study. Julie describes Anmy as "gifted, motivated, engaged, intellectually curious, and possesses genuine empathy towards others with a driving commitment to contribute to the culture of her community."

From Anme's essay: "Born in the Dominican Republic, I have always loved my musical heritage. From my semester abroad in South Africa to musically oriented trips in Hawaii and South Korea, my inclination towards musical study allowed me to connect with other musicians from different traditions. I learned many traditional South African spirituals, mostly in Xhosa. In Hawaii, my musical inclination allowed me to connect with native Hawaiians through their indigenous chants."

Webster is graduating from Spokane Community College with his High School Diploma and Associate of Arts Degree. Opal is graduating from her home school program. Both students will continue to participate in music throughout their future years and the gift of music will be part of their lives as a result of these years of study.
